### OhioHealth's Get up and Go

You can now develop your own board game with a group of 4 to 5 friends.

1. Each player has to develop 10 trivia questions. The questions can be about anything; general knowledge, history, science, geography, sport, politics, television, books etc.
2. The room will be made into a giant size game board where each player will lay out 10 pieces of paper in front of them. Each paper represents a square on the game board with the 10th paper being the finish.
3. One player is chosen as the moderator. He/she will ask the trivia questions (as developed by the players) to each player in turn.
4. For every question answered correctly; the player moves themselves forward to the next game square.
5. For every answer that is incorrect, each player does 5 jumping jacks.
6. The first player that gets to the finish square wins, or the group that is closest to the finish line after all the questions have been asked, wins.

#### *Suggestion:*

You could also divide yourselves into 2 groups and have the groups challenge each other taking turns and asking each other questions moving forward.

#### Here's a fun way to learn about Ohio history

1. Using either the newspaper or newspaper website address, find an article that you think could be considered a key point in Ohio history 10 years from now.
2. Write a brief 3-4 sentences detailed explanation as to why you think it could be a key point.

You could also put your article in a "time capsule" and keep them for a year. Once the year is over, determine whether your article is still news-worthy, pertinent, or relevant.
